The Pupil Premium 2017 – 2018

The Pupil Premium provides funding for pupils:

- who have been receipt of school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (£1320 per child)
- who have been continuously looked after for the past 6 months (£1900 per child)
- for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300 per child)
- Pupils in Nursery who are eligible for FSM (£302.10)

It is really important that all parents/carers of children eligible to do so register for free school meals even if you do not choose to have them as the grant enables us to provide extra resources for Pupil Premium children.

National Research has shown that children who have been or are on free school meals do not attain as highly as other children in school. The government provides this grant so that we can allocate additional support to ensure that they do. The support can be in a short burst or over a longer time such as a term or two terms. It may take the form of 1:1 or small group teaching and may be an evidence based intervention.

The government allows us to spend this money in a variety of ways making sure that it impacts on children in terms of improving their literacy and mathematical skills and their social and emotional well-being and happiness.

Schools are held accountable for the spending of the PPG(Pupil Premium Grant). Published performance tables will report the achievement of disadvantaged pupils in covered by the Pupil Premium.
